The congregation of Morning Star Missionary Baptist Church right here in Flint, Michigan is busy constructing their new complex. This 110' octagon was the result of hard work from our friends at both Berry, Case and Associates architects, and Will H. Hall and Son General Contractors.

We're thankful for all the time that architect, Bill Berry, and general contractor, Terry Mayberry, put into making this project a reality.

After working in Flint our crew made their way to Lexington, Kentucky to install laminated arches and our SIP roof deck system for the folks at Lexington Seventh Day Adventist Church. This was our first project with both the LCM Company and EOA Architects, but we are looking forward to others together. Eddie Ouelette designed the rectangle and Linden Long's crew is working as the general contractor.

On July 21, Linesville First Baptist Church celebrated their dedication.

We built the church's 82' octagon in September of 2001. Cogun Industries acted as the design/build professional on this project. As always we enjoy working with them. Both Eric Payer and Lon Harvey represented Cogun with the highest of professionalism.

On August 3, Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Birch Run, Michigan celebrated the dedication of their new church complex. Their sanctuary, a 100'

octagon, features a wood deck ceiling both on the interior of the sanctuary and in the narthex area. Jed Dingens, from Herrington, Dingens and Assoc., was the architect and Dave Keel from William Bronner and Son worked as the on-site supervisor for this project.

Last, but certainly not least are two of AET, Inc.'s projects, Brookhaven Wesleyan Church, in Marion, IN and Farmland Friends Church, of Farmland, IN. Architect Robert Arrendale did a spectacular job in making these projects a reality. Both buildings were 110' geodesic domes with 18' sidewalls.
